FOUR NEW YORK CITY NONPROFITS SELECTED AS FINALISTS FOR TWO \$100,000 IMPACT 100 NYC INNOVATION GRANTS

Women's Philanthropic Giving Circle to Bestow \$214,00 in Grants at Annual Meeting on May 19

NEW YORK, NY – May 4, 2022 – Impact 100 NYC announced four New York City nonprofits are moving on to the final round in its annual awarding of grants to organizations helping residents and communities of the five boroughs thrive.

In its mission to make a lasting impact through the power of collective giving and collaborative action, the all-women all-volunteer philanthropic giving circle aggregates individual donations from its members into high-impact grants. This year, Impact 100 NYC will bestow \$214,000 in grants from 214 members, selecting two of the four finalists to receive Innovation Grants of at least \$100,000, double the number of grants from its inaugural year in 2021. The 2022 finalists are:

<u>Futures and Options</u> empowers New York City's youth, particularly youth of color and students from historically underrepresented communities, to acquire transferable professional skills, pursue higher education, and successfully compete in a global 21st century economy.

With hydroponic farm-classrooms built in city schools, along with a Discovering Sustainability Science K-12 curriculum, <u>NY Sun Works</u> provides a year-round, hands-on, and project-based sustainability science education through the lens of urban farming.

Through its portfolio of nature-based programs, <u>Trail Blazers</u> helps young people to learn, grow, and thrive by integrating social-emotional development based on "Four Pillars" – Care for Self; Care for Others; Care for Community; Care for Environment.

Using the power of credible messengers and peer-to-peer engagement – former foster youth and adoptive parents of foster youth – <u>You Gotta Believe!</u> connects youth in foster care to permanent and adoptive families.

"It is evident from the applications," said Hope Buerkle, Impact 100 NYC Founding Board Member and Grants Committee Chair, "that these organizations face unprecedented demands for their services along with fundraising challenges. Our goal is to provide high-impact grants that reach underserved populations and meet unmet needs throughout the city; raise the profiles of deserving but lesser-known initiatives; and help organizations dream big."

"In our second year, we again faced a decision-making challenge given the caliber of organizations applying for our grants, and the invaluable benefit and impact they make," added Buerkle "As we evaluate the proposals, either for new programs or projects or significant expansions of existing ones, a key criteria is the potential for the grants to transform these organizations, communities and lives of New Yorkers."

Member-comprised grant review committees (GRCs) determined the four finalists after a rigorous application and review process. At the organization's annual meeting on May 19, each finalist will present to the entire membership, which then votes to select the two grant recipients. Each of the 214 members receives one vote.

Additionally, Impact 100 NYC's newly-launched high school initiative, <u>nextgen</u>, which gives teens hands-on social impact experience, has also conducted a grant review and selection process. Modeled on Impact 100 NYC's collective approach to philanthropy, <u>nextgen</u> teen members are learning and practicing grant-making, fundraising, taking part in community service, and meeting like-minded do-gooders from across the city. Later this month, they will bestow their first grant.

In its inaugural year, Impact 100 NYC, announced \$147,000 in grants in May 2021 to four New York City nonprofit organizations, awarding its first-ever Innovation Grant of \$102,000 to Fiver Children's Foundation, a comprehensive youth development organization that makes a 10-year commitment to children from underserved communities throughout New York City and central New York. Additionally, three finalists, George Jackson Academy, Reaching Out Community Services, and Youth Represent, were recognized for meeting critical needs and providing vital services, and each awarded a \$15,000 general operating grant to help further their missions.
